

Discussion Questions for Who Cares? Week 3

James 1: 27: Religion/Worship that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.

1. This weekend, Jim used the term “a worshipful response to what God has been teaching”. There are many ways to respond to what God teaches. What do you think a “worshipful” response means?
2. Jesus compared our spiritual needs to that of a person who is sick who wants to get better. He even says that this is the reason he came. Staying with the comparison of physical health to spiritual health, what are some of the symptoms in your spiritual life that you are becoming less healthy? If you are willing, can you share some of your past experiences that you now recognize as spiritual symptoms of “getting sick”?
3. Getting physically healthy doesn't just happen by chance. Neither does any other kind of health. What does it take to have a healthy... (address as many as you feel comfortable addressing):

- marriage?
- family?
- finances?
- sex life?
- friendship?

4. What are some steps/decisions/choices that would be wise to make if you are going to get healthier in any of the above areas?
5. Most of us want to get “closer to God”. Since God never changes or moves, what is it that would be wise for you to take in your pursuit of more intimacy with God?
